13.1 Divesting of Sport and Recreation budget allocation for 2024/25

Summary

Council to consider the divesting of funds and assets allocated to the Sport and Recreational program of the 2024/25 budget to the Ngaanyatjarra Council.

Background

Historically, the Shire of Ngaanyatjarraku has managed and delivered the Sport and Recreation program to three communities within its jurisdiction. However, over time, the Shire's capacity and resources have reduced, and as a result the program was only offered in Warburton.

Comment

Discussions held between the CEO of the Ngaanyatjarra Council (NG Council) and the Shire of Ngaanyatjarraku, have indicated that the NG Council is in a better position to deliver the Sport and Recreation program to the Ngaanyatjarra communities.

Following consultations with the Shire's legal and financial advisors, it has been confirmed that the Shire is authorised to gift its budgeted Sport and Recreational funding of \$270,000 to the NG Council. Additionally, the Shire could transfer ownership of the program's Toyota Landcruiser, valued at approximately \$50,000, to the NG Council.

The vehicle, which has a zero written-down value and no current depreciation expense in the 2024/25 budget, and could be considered surplus. Other options to consider could include either selling the vehicle. If sold, the income from the sale could contribute to the Shire's funds, while gifting it would result in the loss of potential sale income.

Statutory Environment

Local Government Act 1995

- 2.7. Role of council
- (1) The council
 - (a) governs the local government's affairs; and
 - (b) is responsible for the performance of the local government's functions.
- (2) Without limiting subsection (1), the council is to -
 - (a) oversee the allocation of the local government's finances and resources; and



(b) determine the local government's policies.

Financial Implications

The amount of \$270,000 would be debited from the 2024/25 Annual Budget and the Asset PE082 (Toyota Landcruiser 1GJT224) gifted to the NG Council.

With the Shire gifting the vehicle to Council, the only financial impact would be the loss of this income if sold.
